Crew Biographies

Benjamin T. Brammeier

Producer/Writer/Director/Editor

Born in St. Louis, MO, Ben began his film career in Chicago after graduating from film school at Southern Illinois University Carbondale in December, 2001. He started PAing on independent features, shorts and commercials and has since ascended the production ladder to Assistant Director.

As a writer/director Ben established a theme of social responsibility with his student films, a theme shared by "Saturday." Knowing what messages a film sends, both intentional and unintentional, and how they can affect audiences and the general public is a constant consideration in his films.

"Saturday" marks his directorial debut outside of film school. His student short "Population" screened in the 2001 St. Louis Filmmakers Showcase and won 1st Prize in the 2001 World Population Film and Video Festival.

Ben currently lives in Chicago and works throughout the Midwest.

Dave Carlson

David Carlson began his career in Chicago in 1985 as an editor for WCFC-TV. He traveled the world from 1989 to 1995, shooting documentaries and programs for PBS, CNN, TLC, and CNBC, among others.
